## Lakeshore Neighborhood Park Update

July 2008



### Public input requested on proposed park concept plan

Clark County Public Works and Vancouver-Clark Parks and Recreation have drafted a proposed concept plan for Lakeshore Neighborhood Park. This plan was developed based on the project budget, and on public input received in May 2008.

Lakeshore Neighborhood Park is located on Northwest 99th Street at 21st Avenue. Construction is scheduled to begin by 2012. Construction may start earlier if funding allows.

The proposed concept plan for this park (see inside page) includes the following features:

- Wheelchair-accessible walking trail
- A playground
- Sports court?
- Open lawn play area
- Two picnic tables and two benches
- Garbage cans, bike rack and signs
- Additional trees and other landscaping

The county will also build a sidewalk along the park side of Northwest 21st Avenue between Northwest 99th and 96th streets.

### What about the proposed mini-mod soccer fields?

Clark County has decided not to include mini-mod soccer fields at Lakeshore Neighborhood Park. This decision was made because adequate and convenient off-street parking during practices and games is not available.

The county is currently looking for other sites in this area that may be better suited for these fields. For more information about this and other youth sport field development projects in Clark County, please call Scott Brantley at (360) 619-1113.

### What's next?

#### Key Points

  1. Vantage point for viewing open area
  2. Concrete retaining/seating wall along west side

- Large planting beds
- Secondary Loop Trail
- No skate spot
